

Rules of Conduct for the OSU-Oklahoma City Library



- The OSU-Oklahoma City Library is a place for quiet research, consultation and study. Appropriate conduct is expected from all that use the facilities.
- Group study rooms are available on a first come/first serve basis. Occasionally a room may be reserved by the Library Staff for special circumstances. In this instance, a sign will be placed on the door to inform the Library users.

Unacceptable Conduct

- Library users should not be noisy or unruly.
- Library users should not bring pets into the Library. Seeing Eye dogs or other service dogs are exceptions.
- Library users should not bring food or beverages into the Library.
- Library users should not use tobacco in any form; tobacco use is prohibited by university policy except in specified outdoor areas.

Study Groups/Rooms

- Small study groups may use the tables in the Library.
- Larger groups are encouraged to use the Study Rooms.
- Lounge areas should not be used for loud conversations.

Internet

- Student computers are primarily for research use. Users of chat rooms and Internet surfers may be asked to relinquish a computer if it is needed for legitimate research use.

Children

- Unattended children are not allowed in the Library. Attended children are permitted, but must remain with an adult. If a problem develops, you may be asked to remove the child from the Library.

Violations

- Patrons violating Library policies regarding conduct will be informed of the rules and asked to comply.
- Failure to comply may result in a call to the OSU-Oklahoma City Security Department.
